General Rules

**The Classic Horse Challenge and Futurity Draft are open to ALL horses 4 years of age and under
ACA rule A.15: Futurity Drafts**

(a) the definition of a Futurity Draft is for horses four years and under.

(b) A horse's birthdate will be determined by the papers registration.

(c) Unregistered horses must be accompanied by a vet certificate stating their age at owners expense.

Riders under the age of 18 must wear helmets whilst mounted on a horse at all ACA affiliated events.

Helmets must comply with current Australian and New Zealand safety standards and be securely fastened under the chin at all times.

Colts and Stallions must be kept under control at all times and are not to be handled/ridden by juniors under 17 years.

Stallion containment ACA rule 11.12 Stallion Containment Requirements Minimum Stallion

Containment Requirements In daylight hours you may either: A: Stallions to be double tied. Stallions to have an exclusion perimeter erected around the horse and area they are tied to exclude any possible interaction between the stallion and another horse or human. OR B: Stallions to be enclosed by panels.

Stallions can be free to roam inside the panel area when an exclusion perimeter is erected around the panelled area to exclude any possible interactions between the stallion and another horse or human.

Only 1 horse allowed per enclosure. Panels must be a minimum of 1500mm in height. Panels must be constructed using an equivalent of 4 bars of 25mm box or pipe equivalent as a minimum. Panels must be anchored securely to a solid object i.e. truck, post or tree. At night: The same rules apply to daylight hours with the addition for a stallion that is in panels must have at least one additional form of restraint e.g.: tied up, hobbles, sideline.

ACA rule 9.4 The status of a horse winning a campdraft will be determined by the highest class of horse that competes with the exception of Juniors, Juveniles, Ladies, Old Buffers, Associates and Encouragement campdrafts. The winner attains the status of the highest class of horse participating (e.g. if one Open horse competes then it is classed as an Open draft.

ACA rules apply regarding scratching's – Rule D5

All competitors compete at their own risk. Competitors must be ACA members for all events except for ASH Led Classes and ASH Open Campdraft – must be ASH registered, ridden by a financial member of the ASHS.

The committee reserves the right to alter/amend the Program at any time.

Challenge Rules

Long sleeve shirt with scarf/tie and hat/helmet. Australian saddle (no horn), simple snaffle bit with one joint, no twisted wire bits, no nosebands or tie-downs allowed.

Rookie Rider definition: Not to have placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any of the listed challenges: Cloncurry, Rocky Rush, Flinders Classic, Grass Hut, Springsure, Paradise, Horse of the North, Monto, Koumala or Nebo. Also not to have won an open aged Campdraft.

All challenges consist of 2 sections judged out of 100 points. Top ten proceed to final – no clean slate.

Dry work: Patterns will be available on ACA website shortly or by contacting Debbie on 0428 712 462. Zero score for a manoeuvre will be given at the judge's discretion for: horse out of control, rider falling, major deviation from pattern, omitting a manoeuvre.

Cattle work: Full yard of cattle except for under 13 years. Losing the beast back to the mob twice will result in no score for cut out. The beast will be removed and the run will continue outside. 1 peg for first and second and one gate peg to allow for either left or right hand course. If a peg is missed ride on – one attempt at each peg. To be scored 25 points for cut out and 25 points for each circle outside. Outside runs will be scored until disqualified or run is completed (must complete 3 circles - ride to whip).

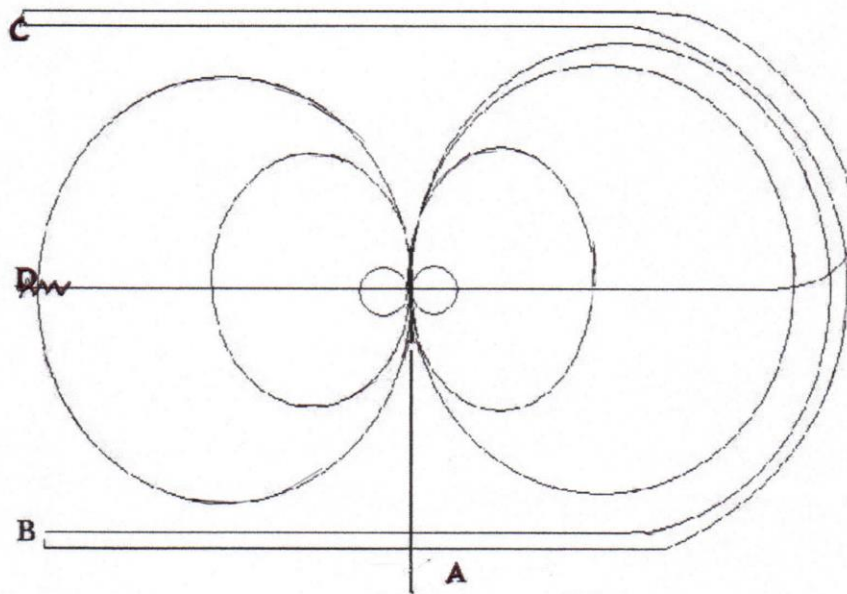

| 5. Canter large fast circle to right, flying change. | 10 |
| 6. Canter small slow circle to left. | 10 |
| 7. Canter large fast circle to left, flying change. | 10 |
| 8. Canter large fast circle to right, don't close circle run down to B, stop, hesitate, rollback to left. | 10 |
| 9. Canter fast around end of arena run down to C, stop, hesitate, rollback to right. | 10 |
| 10. Canter fast around end of arena, run down centre line to D, stop, back up 3 metres, acknowledge judge, leave arena on loose rein. | 10 |
